


Symbicort[®] Turbuhaler[®] 120 dose

How to prepare a new inhaler for use and using the inhaler


Unscrew the cover and lift it off. Hold the inhaler upright with the red grip at the bottom. Do not hold the mouthpiece when you turn the grip. Twist the grip as far as it will go in one direction 2 and then twist it back in the opposite direction. Hold your Turbuhaler away from your mouth. Breathe out gently. Do not breathe out through the mouthpiece. **Inhale** in deeply and forcefully through your mouth. Hold your breath for 5~10 seconds. Do not chew or bite the mouthpiece. 5 **Remove the inhaler** from your mouth before you breathe out. Replace the cover.

If you have to be prescribed more than one inhalation, repeat steps 2-5.

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Be aware of...

- 1. Replace the cover properly after use.
- 2. The sound that you hear as you shake the inhaler is produced by a drying agent and not the medicine.
- 3. If you load your Turbuhaler more than once by mistake before taking your dose, you will still only receive one dose. However, the dose indicator will register all the loaded doses.



How do I know when to replace the inhaler?

- The dose indicator shows how many doses remain in the inhaler, starting with '120' when the inhaler is full.
- When the 'O' has reached the middle of the window, it means the device is empty, and you must discard the inhaler.
- 3. The grip will still twist and 'click' even when the inhaler is empty.
